- to learn about Canadian society and culture**

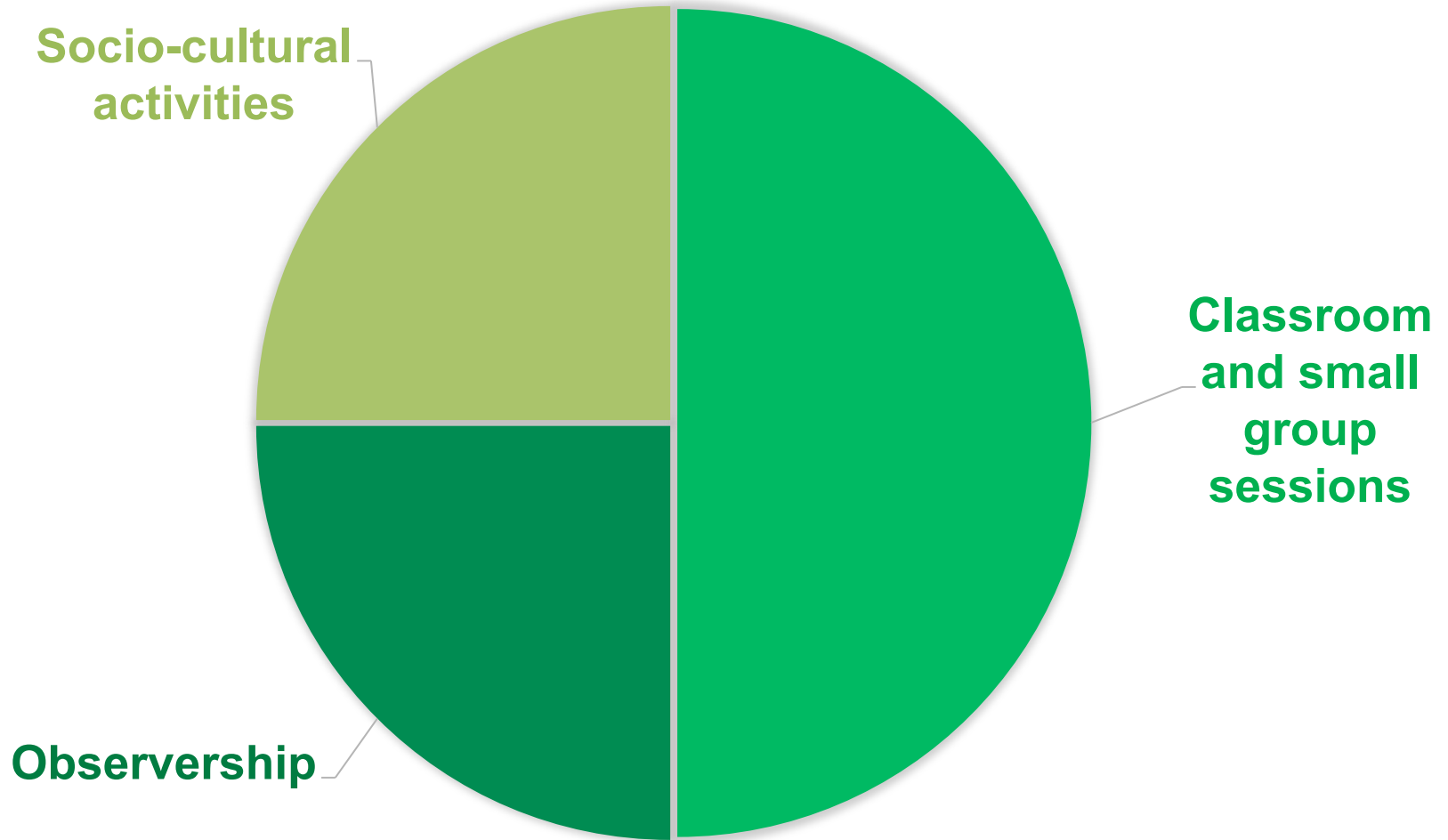
Course Objectives:
